

Rachel Vogelstein is an expert on domestic and global policy to advance gender equality. She is currently a Professor and Director of the Program on Human Rights, Gender, and Equity at Columbia University's School of International and Public Affairs, where she also serves as Director of the Women's Initiative at Columbia's Institute of Global Politics.

Most recently, Vogelstein served in the Biden Administration concurrently as Special Assistant to the President and Deputy Director of the White House Gender Policy Council and as Special Advisor on Gender at the White House National Security Council. In this capacity, she led U.S. efforts to advance women's economic security, democracy and political participation, safety, education, health and reproductive rights, among other issues.

For over a decade, Vogelstein was an advisor to Secretary Hillary Rodham Clinton on women's issues, serving on both of her presidential campaigns and as the Director of Women's and Girls' Initiatives at the Clinton Foundation. During the Obama Administration, Vogelstein was an official in the Secretary's Office of Global Women's Issues at the U.S. Department of State, where she developed a landmark foreign policy agenda for women's empowerment.

Vogelstein is the author of *Awakening: #MeToo and the Global Fight for Women's Rights* (2021), which was recognized as a notable book by the *New York Times* for capturing the global impact of the groundbreaking #MeToo movement. She previously was the Douglas Dillon Senior Fellow and Director of the Women and Foreign Policy Program at the Council on Foreign Relations, and a Fellow at the Center for Global Legal Challenges at Yale Law School.

A lawyer by training, Vogelstein began her career working on women's health and reproductive rights at the National Women's Law Center and ACLU Reproductive Freedom Project. She has served on the boards of the National Women's History Museum and Planned Parenthood Global and is a member of the Leadership Coalition for Women in National Security.
